# **Preparing for a Trial**

#### **LESSON PLAN:**

#### Objective:

To prepare the students to take part in the mock trial.

#### Aims:

- To improve the students' understanding of court procedure by focusing closely on one case
- To ensure that the students focus on their particular role in this mock trial

#### Resources:

- Teacher's Notes: List of Roles in the
  Trial
- The Legal Case
- The Indictment
- Statements of Prosecution Witnesses
- Statements of Defence Witnesses
- Completed question sheet from 'Student Handout - Key Questions' from the topic 'A Mock Trial in Action'.

### **Key Questions:**

- If you are a \_\_\_\_\_
   what will you be doing during the trial?
- What sort of issues, on both sides, could a case like this bring up?
- Why is this a criminal case, rather than a civil case? Could this be a civil case?

**Duration: 70 (35 + 35) minutes** 

#### **Part One**

Introduction: (20 minutes)

Teacher conducts a class discussion around the students' notes/answers made while watching and discussing the video during Lessons 2 and 3.

Teacher explains how the class will be divided for the mock trial, the roles involved and how those roles will be assigned.

#### **Development and Closure: (15 Minutes)**

- Using The Case and The Indictment teacher explains the case that will be the subject of the mock trial. Teacher gives these handouts to each student.
- Teacher assigns the roles for the mock trial using whatever method he/she finds most appropriate. All students in the class should be involved as much as possible (for example as newspaper or TV reporters, sketch artists, gardaí, etc).
- Teacher and class complete the blanks in The Indictment for location and dates (names can be changed to suit teacher and students).
- Prosecution Witnesses to those with prosecution roles. Each witness must fill in the blanks in his/her own statement.



- Teacher gives Statements of Defence
   Witnesses to those with defence roles.
   Each witness must fill in the blanks in
   his/her own statement.
- The class discusses the function of each role.
  - Students must prepare for their roles. This may require out-ofclass meetings of prosecution barristers, solicitors and witnesses and the same for the defence.

# **Part Two**

## (35 minutes)

Use time to recap on Part 1. This gives the students an opportunity to practice their roles in the Mock Trial.
